


#### **Create Your Own Winter Safety Kit!**

- Ice scraper
- Small shovel and broom
- Winter window-washing solvent
- Jumper cables
- Warning flares
- Tool kit
- Rope or chains
- Flashlight
- Blankets and extra gloves, coats and hats

- Bottled water and snacks
- First-aid kit
- Sand, kitty litter or road salt for traction
- Cell phone and battery operated charger
- Battery-operated radio and batteries

#### Emergency alerts vs local warning sirens

What's the connection between the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and the warning sirens you hear in your town? There is none.

EAS was designed by the Federal Communications Commission to quickly send urgent emergency information to an area. EAS is a digital, automated system that alerts broadcast media, cable television, satellites, direct broadcast satellite and high-definition television. EAS meets the needs of the hearing impaired and those with different language needs.

Emergency sirens are outdoor warning systems that many Ohio areas activate locally to alert residents of threatening conditions. Sirens sometimes aren't audible indoors or in densely populated areas, but are a helpful supplement to the EAS. Optimally, on a flat terrain with no wind, most sirens can be heard up to one

National and local text-alert systems are another method used to alert cell-phone users of emergencies. These alerts aren't offered in all areas, but their use is increasing each year.

# Janet's "Candied Nuts" Recipe

1 lb. walnuts or pecans Ingredients:

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. cinnamon

1 cup sugar

1 egg white

1 tbsp. water



Beat egg white and water until frothy, add nuts and mix until coated with egg mixture. In large plastic zip lock bag, add sugar, salt and cinnamon—shake gently to mix. Add egg coated nuts to the sugar mixture in the bag; shake gently to cover nuts with sugar.

Spread nuts on parchment paper, spray nuts very lightly with butter spray (optional).

Bake at 250 degrees for 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes.

Cool, store in air tight containers or zip lock bags.
